The Former Lowry Bombing and Gunnery Range, formally known as Buckley Field, is located in Arapahoe County, approximately 20 miles southeast of Denver and adjacent to the city of Aurora, Colorado.

Portions of the FLBGR served as a military munitions training range for the Department of Defense for over 40 years. The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and its contractors have been conducting investigation, characterization, and clearance activities at the Range since 1998. 5-Year Review

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, in conjunction with the Colorado Department of Public Health and the Environment and U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, are conducting a 5-year review of this project. This review is to evaluate ongoing munitions response activities and determine if the approach continues to reduce explosive safety risks and is protective of human health, safety and the environment with regard to projected future land uses.

The munitions response approach being conducted at the Range consists of locating, investigating, classifying, removing and disposing of munitions and munitions-related material resulting from past military training activities. A variety of technologies and approaches are being used for response activities to ensure that munitions and munitions related-materials are found and removed.

The 5-year review process includes these primary activities:

- Document reviews
- Interviews with key Range stakeholders
- Site inspections of work areas

An overview of the 5-year review process and schedule, and how the community can be involved, will be presented at the April 20th RAB meeting.
